Tier 3 Descriptive Paper

The Tier-III examination is a descriptive paper in English or Hindi. Candidates are required to write essays, précis, application letters, and more.

Tier 4 Skill Test/Computer Proficiency Test

1. **Data Entry Speed Test (DEST):** Candidates are required to have a Data Entry Speed of 8,000 key depressions per hour on the computer. The test is conducted for the post of Tax Assistant (Central Excise & Income Tax).
2. **Computer Proficiency Test (CPT):** This test assesses the proficiency of candidates in using Microsoft Office tools. It is applicable for the posts of Assistant Section Officer (CSS) and Assistant Section Officer (MEA).
