2. Name the seven continents in the world?

Ans. Antarctica, Asia, Africa, Australia, Europe, North America, South America

3. Where is India located in the world?

Ans. India has a central location between East and West Asia.

4. The central location of India at the head of the Indian Ocean is considered of great significance. Why?

Ans. 1. In Indian Ocean, India has largest coast line because Deccan peninsula. India has a southward extension of the Asian continent.

2. By Indian western coast we closely connect with west Asia, Africa and Europe

3. By Indian eastern coast we closely connect with South East Asia, East Asia and Australia.

4. India connects with others countries both by land and sea routes but her relationships through land routes are much older than marine routes.

5. From a long time we exchange our ideas and commodities by land routes with others countries.

6. Through these routes the ideas of the Upanishads and the Ramayana, the stories of the panchtantra, the Indian numerals and the decimal system, spices etc. thus could reach many parts of the world.
