<b>Tenses</b>	<b>Affirmative</b>	<b>Negative</b>	<b>Interrogative</b>
<b>Indefinite</b>	Ahmed goes. I go. We go.	Ahmed does not go. I do not go. We do not go.	Does Ahmed go? Do I go? Do we go?
<b>Continuous</b>	Ahmed is going. I am going. We are going.	Ahmed is not going. I am not going. We are not going.	Is Ahmed going? Am I going? Are we going?
<b>Perfect</b>	Ahmed has gone. I have gone. We have gone.	Ahmed has not gone. I have not gone. We have not gone.	Has Ahmed gone? Have I gone? Have we gone?
<b>Perfect Continuous</b>	Ahmed has been going. I have been going. We have been going.	Ahmed has not been going. I have not been going. We have not been going.	Has Ahmed been going? Have I been going? Have we been going?

### PRESENT PERFECT TENSE

Statement -

Subject + has/have + past participle of the verb  
(V<sub>3</sub>)

Negative Sentence -

Subject + has/have + not + past participle of the  
main verb.

Question -

Has/have + subject + past participle of the main  
verb.

# { Has → Singular subject  
Have → plural subject }

## SUBJECT AND PREDICATE

SENTENCE

SUBJECT

PREDICATE

Example :

Riya's sisters attend piano classes on weekends.

Subject : first part of the sentence; tells us what or who the sentence is about

Predicate : comes after the subject; contains a verb; tells something about the subject

SUBJECT : usually a noun or a noun phrase.

ex: Fruits contain vitamins. (noun as a subject)

→ The exercises in the maths textbook are difficult.  
(noun phrase as subject)

PREDICATE : must contain a verb. It can also contain other elements like :- objects, complements all depending on the nature of the verb.

## CHAPTER: 2 PREPOSITIONS

### \* COLLOCATIONS

Certain nouns, adjectives and verbs are generally used with specific prepositions in such a way that these have become fixed ways of using these words. We often refer to such combinations as collocations.

→ Some expressions with prepositions:

Noun + preposition	Adjective + preposition	verb + preposition
need for	afraid of	ask for
respect for	angry at	care for
interest in	fond of	find out
